## A day here or there doesn't seem like much, but...

# The best learning time for students is the start of the school day. Give your child every chance to succeed

- When children regularly arrive late, they miss out on so much.
- They miss out on the lovely morning 'Meet and Greet' which connects children with their classmates, staff and classroom environment.
- We schedule literacy and numeracy for our morning lessons so regular lateness means that children are missing critical learning every day they are away / late.
- Being on time prepares your child for the school day and the routines which support their learning.
- · Remember that every day counts
- There is no safe number of days for missing school each day a student misses puts them behind and can affect their educational outcomes and social connections.
- Talk positively about school and the importance of attending every day.



A reminder that all holiday absences require an Absence Learning Plan, developed with your child's teacher and signed by the Principal or Assistant Principal to cover your child's absence.






## SCIENCE - Forces and Energy at Work.

This term all the students are inquiring into the big concepts.

- Movement: Things move in special ways depending on their size and shape
- Force: Forces can be acted upon when in direct contact or at a distance from an object
- Change: Things move depending of how an object changes its shape
- Energy: Energy can be transferred

#### Preps



The Prep scientists have started off this term's Science inquiry exploring ways to move and groove. They will be finding out about objects that move in particular ways..

#### Year 1-2



The Year 1-2 scientists have started off this term's Science inquiry exploring different ways to push and pull everyday objects. They will be finding out about concepts, Force and Energy through pushing and pulling in water and air.

#### Year 3-4



The Year 3-4 scientists have started off this term's Science inquiry exploring different ways they can move marbles by creating their very own marble game. They will be inquiring about different forces and how these forces can act through direct contact or at a distance.

#### Year 5-6



The Year 5-6 scientists have started off this term's Science inquiry exploring concepts, Forces and Energy. Why not do this with a torch! In collaborative teams, they had to think and draw a cut-away diagram of what they might think is inside a torch to make it work.







